"JUGENDSPRACHREISE" TO THE GDR

An "Aufenthalt in der Deutschen Demokratischen Republik" (Dresden) is planned for 22 persons from May 26 to 31, 1977. Participants will live in a youth hostel in Dresden. A second "Jugendsprachreise" goes to Potsdam (May 31 - June 21, 1977). The total cost will be \$ 634, including flight, transfer costs, accomodations, instruction. The tour starts on May 25 in Montreal, returning June 21 from Frankfurt, West Germany. There will be a maximum of 22 persons on the trip including 3 teachers. If more than 22 people apply, there will be a selection procedure. Application deadline is March 1, 1977.

In Potsdam there will be beginning and advanced language study for 3 hours every morning and 1 hour field research, oral reports etc., followed by afternoon excursions. In Dresden and on weekends there will be full day excursions. The activities include discussions, visiting historic and cultural sites, meeting with members of the FDJ, visiting youth clubs, films, and discotheques.

FERIEN-KURSE FÜR GERMANISTEN IN DER DDR

In einem Wort "An die Kursteilnehmer" im Faltblatt "Internationale Hochschulferienkurse 1977 für Germanistik in der Deutschen Demokratischen Republik" heißt es: "In der Deutschen Demokratischen Republik werden seit 1958 Internationale Hochschulferienkurse für Germanistik durchgeführt, an denen bisher über 10.000 Wissenschaftler und Studenten aus mehr als 40 Ländern teilgenommen und sich in Vorlesungen, Seminaren, Exkursionen und anderen Veranstaltungen mit dem gesellschaftlichen, wissenschaftlichen und kulturellen Leben in der DDR bekannt gemacht haben." Inhalt der Kurse sind Vorträge und Seminare über die Kultur und Politik der DDR, Probleme der Literaturwissenschaft, Sprach- und Übersetzungstheorien, Fremdsprachenmethodik und DDR-Landeskunde. Ferner werden Konversations- und Sprachübungen abgehalten und wird Phonetik-Unterricht erteilt. Exkursionen und Betriebsbesichtigungen stehen ebenfalls auf dem Programm. Die Teilnehmergebühren betragen:

450 M für Germanistenkurse
300 M für Studentenkurse

Die Germanistenkurse werden in Berlin (8. - 30.7.), Weimar (I: 2. - 25.7.; II: 27.7. - 19.8.), Leipzig (I: 8. - 27.8.; II: 31.7. - 20.8.) und Karl-Marx-Stadt (4. - 30.7.) abgehalten, die Studentenkurse in Halle (10. - 31.7.), Rostock (9. - 31.7.), Greifswald (4. - 24.7.) und Berlin (1. - 24.7.). An zusätzlichen Veranstaltungen sind vorgesehen:

Foren, Schriftstellerlesungen, Diskus
nén mit Brigademitgliedern, Lehrern all-
gemeinbildender Schulen und Persönlich-
keiten des öffentlichen Lebens, ferner
die Besichtigung einer landwirtschaft-
lichen Produktionsgenossenschaft sowie
Theater-, Konzert- und Filmbesuche. Die
Kursgebühr schließt Einschreibung, Un-
terkunft, Verpflegung, Lehrmaterial, Ex-
kursionen und kulturelle und wissen-
schaftliche Veranstaltungen ein. Sie
ist bis zum 1. Mai 1977 auf das Konto des
betreffenden Kursveranstalters zu über-
weisen. Es wird empfohlen, ein Taschen-
geld in Höhe von 150 M in Valuta vorzu-
sehen. Als Termin gilt das erste und
letzte Datum der einzelnen Kurse. Die
An- und Rückreise muß vom Teilnehmer
selbst getragen werden.

TRAVEL GUIDE TO GDR

In 1975 the publishing house Zeit im Bild
in Dresden edited a useful Travel Guide
to the German Democratic Republic. It contains
tips for tourists and special chapters on:
the capital Berlin, historic Potsdam, a
tour along Oder River, the Spreewald, the
art capital Dresden with nearby Saxon
Switzerland and Upper Lusatia, Erzgebirge
and Vogtland, the university cities Halle
and Leipzig, Thuringia, historic Kyffhäuser
and Magdeburg, the impressive Harz as well
as the North of the GDR. The guide contains

Illustrations of sites and life in the
GDR. The general map of the GDR has been
split up into several large geographical
regions, and each chapter includes an easy
to read multi-color map covering the area
dealt with. The preface informs about the
frontiers, the topography, climate and
population, the social system, the foreign
policy, the economy, and the cultural
facilities of the country. The handy paper-
back costs 6.90 M and can be ordered at:

INFORMATION FOR TOURISTS TO GDR

The Reisebüro of the German Democratic
Republic (102 Berlin, Alexanderplatz 5)
offers a little brochure with "Information
for Individual Tourists". It contains a
brief overview of the geography and climate,
the currency, public holidays, opening
hours of shops, banks, museums and
restaurants, fares and rates, telephone
charges, and prices for tickets (theater,
concerts, cinema, museums, sports events).
A second part lists hotels and prices for
rooms with and without bath or shower in
cities like Berlin, Leipzig, Dresden, Pots-
dam, Halle, Weimar and smaller towns. It
furthermore informs about three tours
which cover Berlin, Dresden, Meissen and
Leipzig. Tour A takes 3 days (\$ 52, in
own car \$ 33), tour B 5 days (\$ 91 or \$ 72),
and tour B 7 days (\$ 155 or \$ 110). A
final section gives holiday suggestions,
informs about camping possibilities,
transits and currency- and customs-regul-
lations.

"AMERICAN LANDESKUNDE" IN HALLE

RESEARCH AT BERTOLT-BRECHT-
ARCHIV AND HANNS-EISLER-
ARCHIV

As a grantee of the University of Kansas Direct Program, I lived in Mainz, Germany, from October 1975 to August 1976 and conducted research toward a catalogue of musical numbers with texts by Bertolt-Brecht and Hanns-Eisler-Archives. The cooperation and friendliness of the administrators there were of great help to me, and I should like to share my experiences with readers of the "Bulletin".

The Bertolt-Brecht-Archiv is located in the author's post-exile apartment and contains original manuscripts, notes and publications by Brecht as well as most of the secondary works about him. Some materials, especially those with regard to Brecht's early poetry, are held in the newly established Elisabeth-Hauptmann-Collection and are, therefore, less available. For a comprehensive list of the B-B-A's holdings consult: Bestandsverzeichnis des literarischen Nachlasses. 5 Vols., ed. by Hertha Ramthun (Berlin: Aufbau Verlag, 1969). Because the collection is so extensive, work-space is limited, so that the researcher should apply for permission to use the archive approximately three to four months in advance. All serious Brecht-scholars are invited to apply, and an application form may be obtained from: Günter Glaser

Although Hanns Eisler's manuscripts are held in several different collections, the Hanns-Eisler-Archiv contains originals or copies of almost all of the composer's works. The director of the archive was particularly friendly and helpful and has continued to supply me with much useful information, but here, too, work-space is limited. Thus, one should apply early to:

The Berliner Ensemble also proved to be a useful source of information as well as artistic delight. Housed in the old Theater am Schiffbauerdamm, the Ensemble gives

performances nightly at prices ranging from DM 2,- to DM 10,-. Tickets may be reserved by mail or purchased a few days in advance from the box office. During my visits I found the performers and directors very friendly and willing to talk about their performances, and the administration is willing to allow researchers to attend rehearsals, conduct interviews etc. Advance permission for such research is, however, necessary and may be obtained by writing to: Informations-
