VISITING LECTURERS

Professor Joseph Pischel from Wilhelm Pieck University in Rostock will be at Brown University Fall Semester 1981 as a visiting professor in the German Department. He will teach courses on contemporary GDR Literature and on the GDR reception of Brecht to the present day. He would be pleased to speak at other campuses during his stay in the United States (mid September - end of December). He proposes the following topics for lectures:

1. Aktuelle Entwicklungstendenzen der Prosa-Literatur in der DDR
 2. Zum Funktionsverständnis der DDR-Schriftsteller in den siebziger Jahren
 3. "Schwierigkeiten beim Lesen der DDR-Literatur" - Zum Problem der Rezeption der DDR Literatur unter nicht-sozialistischen Gesellschafts- und Literaturverhältnissen
 4. Franz Fühmanns Umgang mit dem Mythos - Ein Beispiel für Wandlungen des Literaturverständnisses in der DDR
 5. Aktuelle Probleme und Streitfragen der Erforschung der deutschen Exilliteratur 1933-1945
 6. Er hat Vorschläge gemacht - Haben wir sie angenommen? Brechts Konzeption einer realistischen Literatur

TRAVEL AND EXCHANGE

The program of faculty and student exchange between Brown University and the University of Rostock has recently been enlarged to encompass all fields (except agriculture) where scholarly exchange can be of mutual use to the two universities. Primary exchange involves medicine, and physics, chemistry and engineering are areas soon to receive more emphasis.

Rostock's Fachpraktikum for advanced students in English, established by Duncan Smith of Brown, will again meet for three weeks in July. It will include 45 students and young faculty members.

Brown faculty members Dagnar Barnouw (German) and David Hirsch (English), among numerous others, are scheduled to make visits to Rostock soon. GDR visitors to Brown include Horst Hoene, professor of English and American literature, and Joseph Pischel, chairman of the section of languages and literatures at Rostock (see Visiting Lecturers).

The Rostock-Brown student exchange now includes participation in the regular term of study. Ten students from Brown will travel to Rostock this summer, and as many as eight may enroll in the regular term there next fall. It is hoped that several Rostock students will take courses and pursue their research at Brown next year.

Duncan Smith, director of the Brown-Rostock exchange program, plans to organize a meeting soon of individuals already directing or intending to direct programs of cooperative academic exchange with the GDR.

6. Sozialpolitische Programme in der DDR und in anderen RGW-Staaten. Sozialistische Sozialpolitik in den 80er Jahren. (H. Haase)
