CONTEMPORARY GRAPHIC ART OF THE GDR

During the week of the International Symposium on the GDR (June 19-27, 1981) a number of contemporary graphic artists had their works on display. Some of the artist included: Wolf E. Biermann, Carl Friedrich Claus, Fritz Cremer, Hermann Glöckner, Werner Tübke and Max Uhlig. The exhibit was made possible by a Youth Grant of the National Endowment for the Humanities to Ingrid Fenz, University of Michigan, and the generosity of the GDR artists.

SCHONSTE BÜCHER DER DDR DES JAHRES 1980

Anlässlich der Internationalen Leipziger Buchmesse (März 1980) wurden 46 Bücher aus 22 Verlagen als die "schönsten Bücher der DDR" von Albert Kapf (Leipzig) und Horst Kunze (Berlin) ausgezeichnet. Diesmal waren der Eulen-Verlag, der Kinderbuchverlag und der Urania-Verlag besonders erfolgreich. Einige Titeln sind zu erwähnen: Uwe Kants "Wie Janek eine Geschichte hörte", "Berlin--Eine Kulturgeschichte in Bildern und Dokumenten" (Gustav Kiepenheuer Verlag), "Begegnung mit dem Menschen" (Urania-Verlag) und Kleists "Michael Kohlhaas" mit Barlach-Illustration (Aufbau Verlag).

NEUES AUS DER WEZEL-FORSCHUNG

Vor ca. 20 Jahren entdeckte die Germanistik einen grossen Autor des 18.Jhdts. wieder, der bis dahin, grösstenteils missverstanden, ein durchaus verdientes Dornröschen-dasein gefristet hatte. Inzwischen ist es allenthalben sehr lebhaft um ihn geworden. Besonders Wezels Heimatstadt Sondershausen/Thür. hat sich seiner angenommen. Seit 10 Jahren fungiert dort ein Arbeitskreis, der in ca. 30 Veranstaltungen und Vorträgen Wezel ins rechte Licht gerückt hat und weiterhin aktiv zu bleiben verspricht.

Socialism and Emancipation: Reality for GDR Women as Experience and Reflected in Literature
