reception of literary works on the basis of Marxist-Leninist political and economic theory. In connection with this working group, there were meetings with representatives from the journal Neue Deutsche Literatur and the publishing house Der Morgen. A visit to the Bezirksbibliothek Willi Bredel in Rostock gave insight into the organization of public libraries in the GDR, which are well stocked and used extensively by readers.

The working group on contemporary GDR literature was concerned mainly with the reflection in various works of the problems and needs of the individual in modern GDR society. Works by authors such as Christa Wolf, Maxie Wander, Irmtraud Morgner, Christoph Hein and Volker Braun were discussed. Most participants agreed that it would be advantageous to distribute a tentative list of works well before the course begins next year, so that students may be better prepared and bring books with them which are not always available in libraries and bookshops in Rostock.

Participants were also given the opportunity to increase their German language proficiency by attending phonetics courses and small discussion groups (Sprachgruppen) which were formed according to the level of language ability. One of the main problems for the course organizers was that a large proportion of those attending were not Germanists and could speak little or no German. Consequently, some groups had to be converted into elementary language courses.

The program also included readings by the authors Günter Görlich and Frank Weymann, five films, including the controversial film version of Der Aufenthalt by Hermann Kant, and excursions to the islands Hiddensee, Stralsund, Güstrow, and other local places of interest.

On the whole, I consider my visit to the GDR a valuable learning experience. The course organizers and our Betreuer, a group of students from Rostock University--all of them volunteers!--spared no effort to make our stay

as informative and enjoyable as possible. I hope many more Germanists will take this opportunity to visit the GDR and communicate with its citizens and their colleagues from many parts of the world.
