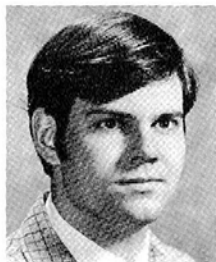

Meet ACE Authors



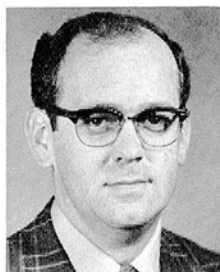
